# **Eliza Aubichon**

We would like to recognize and honor Ilea-la-Crosse Elder and resident, Eliza Aubichon.

Eliza, 84, was born in Îleà-la-Crosse and has lived in this community most of her life.

Growing up in the "bush," she helped her family with berry picking, gardening and fishing, sometimes duck hunting, with a net. She learned how to prepare food from the land and to use it for other purposes, such as creating mittens.

Since she was a young child, Eliza has spent much of her life helping other people. She only knew how to speak Cree until she spent several years in boarding school. Eliza was known as someone who would 'speak for the people,' as she interpreted for those who didn't speak English. She raised 9 children, 4 of whom still live in Îleà-la-Crosse. She loves having children around the house. To this day, she can often be found knitting a pair of socks or beading moccasins in her living room, with her grandchildren and greatgrandchildren close by.

We want to acknowledge Eliza for all of the things she has given to the community and for her participation in our Wuskiwiy-tan! project. She continues to teach and help many of us.
